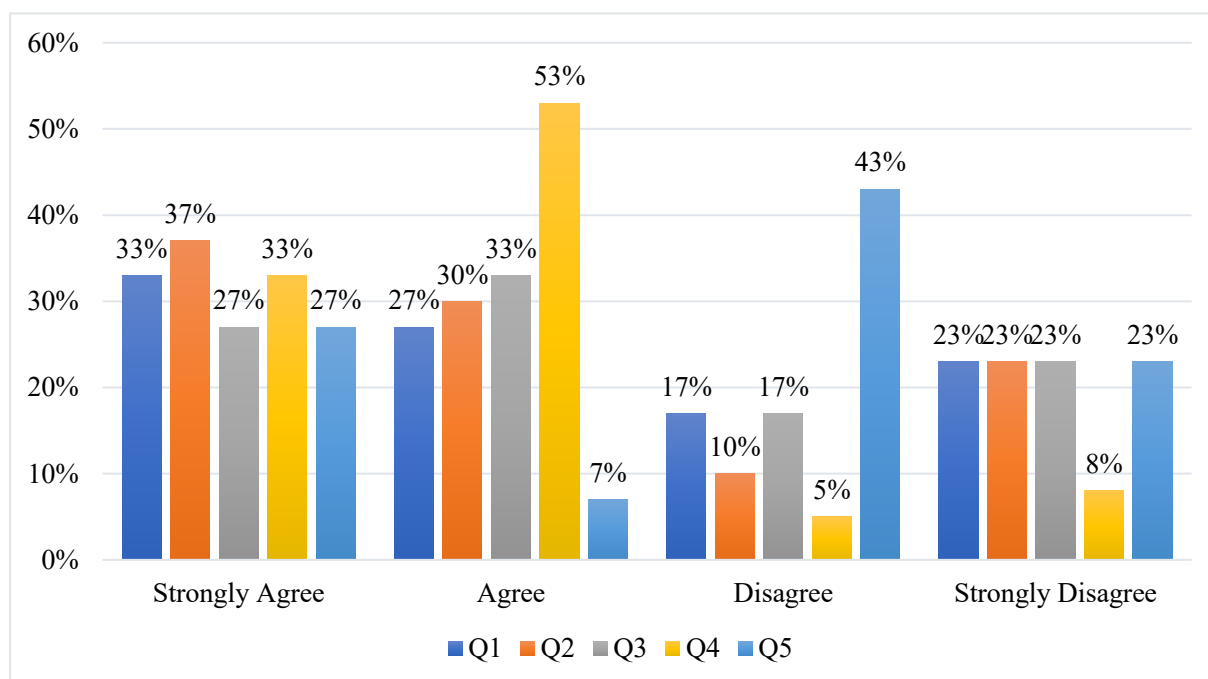


Figure 1. Percentage Responses on the Challenges that Head Teachers Encounter in Managing Incidents of Indiscipline

underscore the critical importance of addressing pupil behavior to foster a conducive learning atmosphere and uphold academic standards.

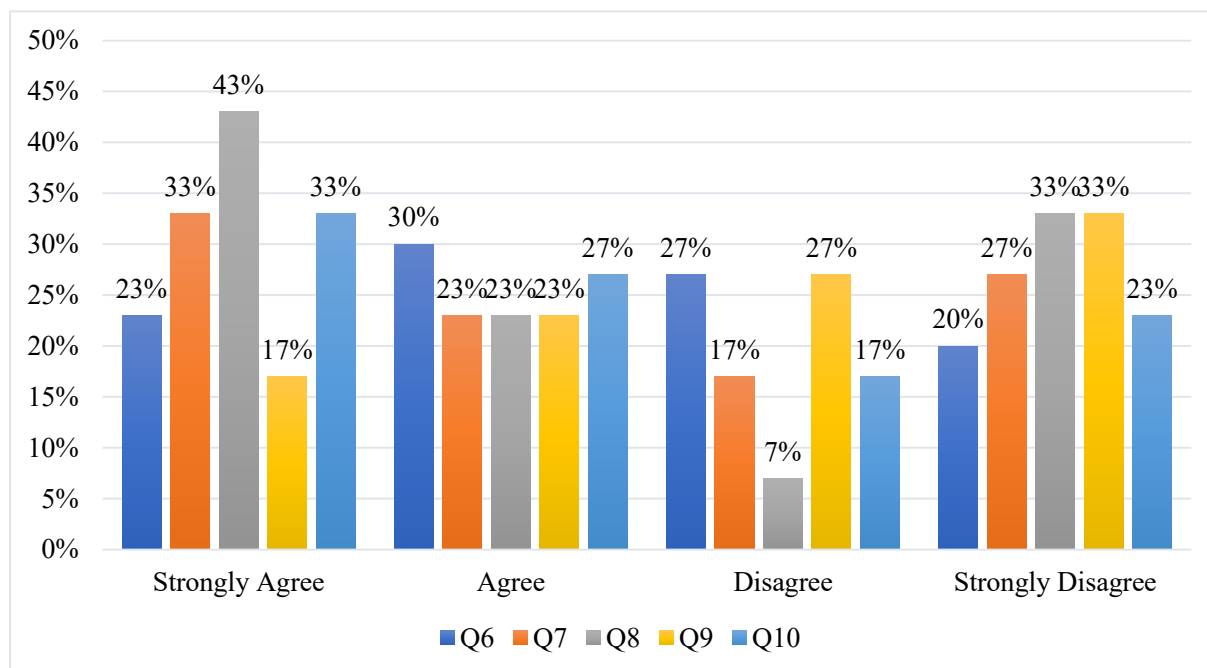


Figure 2. Percentage Responses on the Pupils' Indiscipline Impacts the Overall School Climate and Academic Performance

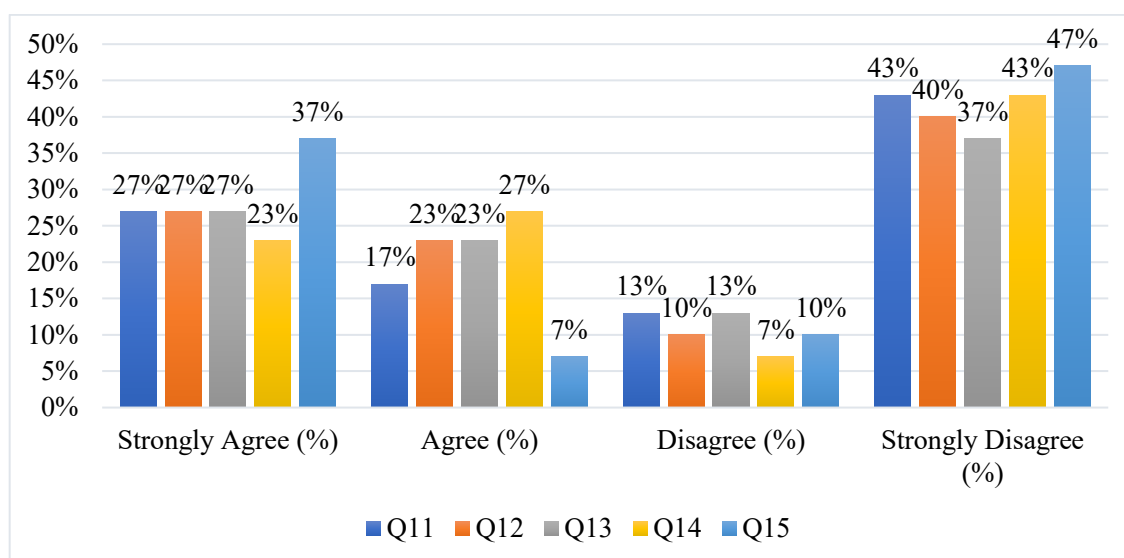


Figure 3. Percentage Responses on the Strategies Can Be Recommended for Enhancing the Management of Pupils' Indiscipline by Head Teachers

Moreover, indiscipline cultivates a climate of disarray and turmoil inside schools, influencing the learning climate for all pupils. Moreover, continuous disturbances in classrooms because of indiscipline can prompt a decrease in academic performance among pupils (Stephen, 2023). In a connected report, Salaudeen et al., (2021) underlined the relationship between's classroom disturbances and scholarly accomplishment.

Research question 3 gives the methodologies that can be suggested for improving the administration of pupils' indiscipline by head teachers in primary schools.
